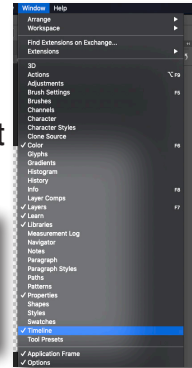




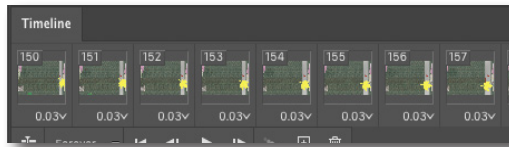
Exporting PSD Animation Layers to Video

If you have created animated layers in a Photoshop file, you can export them as a video file

With your photoshop document open (a .psd file), from the top menu select *Window>Timeline* to open the Timeline window,



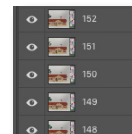
which will open at the bottom of your Photoshop workspace.



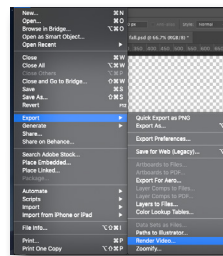
At this point, you will want to shift-click all the frames you wish to export as a video file from within the timeline window.



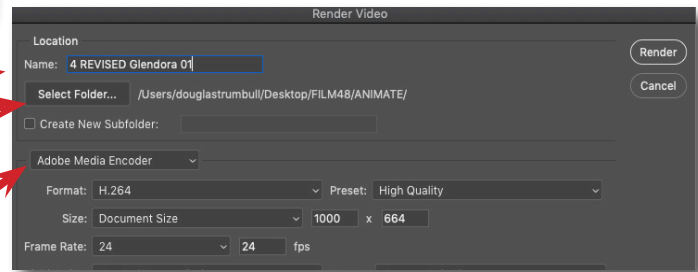
Selecting these frames will activate the visibility of each layer (or frame) you have selected.



With your frames selected, go to the top menu and choose *Export>Render Video*



The Render Video window will open.



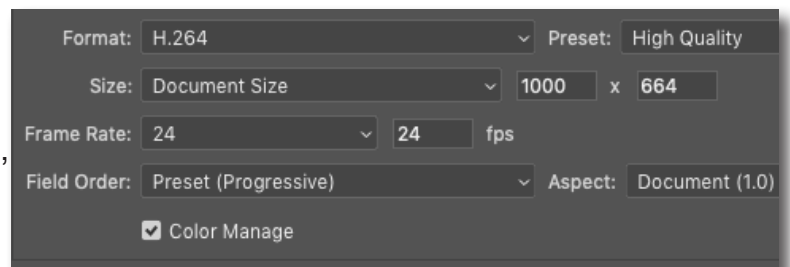
Here you will want to name your file, and choose a location to save it to.

Using “Adobe Encoder” to create your video file will give you the video export options you need.

Next, select your format. “H.264” will give you more options than Quicktime will.

Make sure your preset is set for “High Quality”, and keep your size as “Document Size”, to match what you have built in Photoshop.

Ideally, you set your document size knowing what resolution and format you want your animation to wind up as. Set your frame rate to “24”, and from the top right of the window click the *Render* button.



If your animation has any black frames, check your layers and be sure all the ones you intended to select are set to “visible”.
