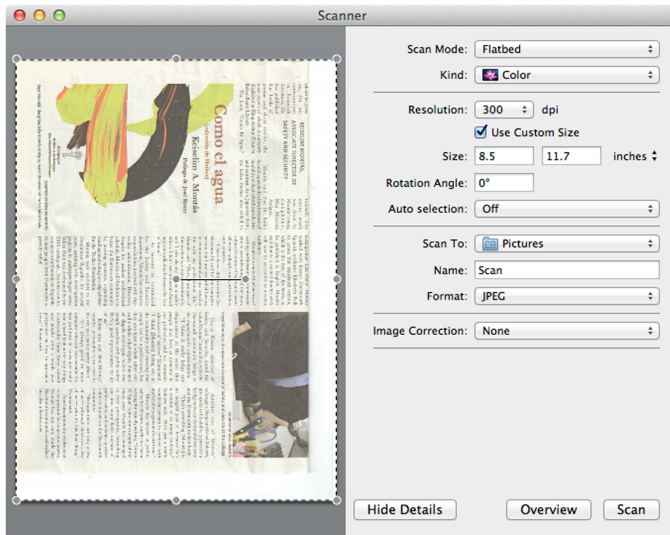


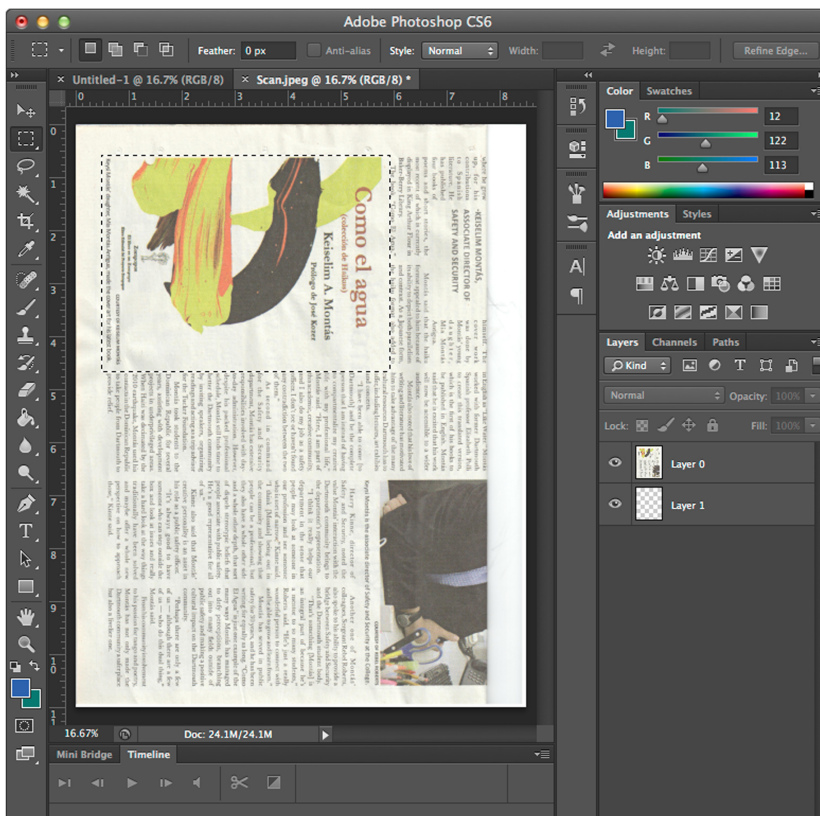

Scanning and Extracting in Photoshop



1. Open the HP LaserJet application. Place your art on the scanner located in the back left corner of the lab. From the HP application open "Scanner". Make sure your scan setting match the settings listed here. 300 DPI is important. Scan and save your artwork.

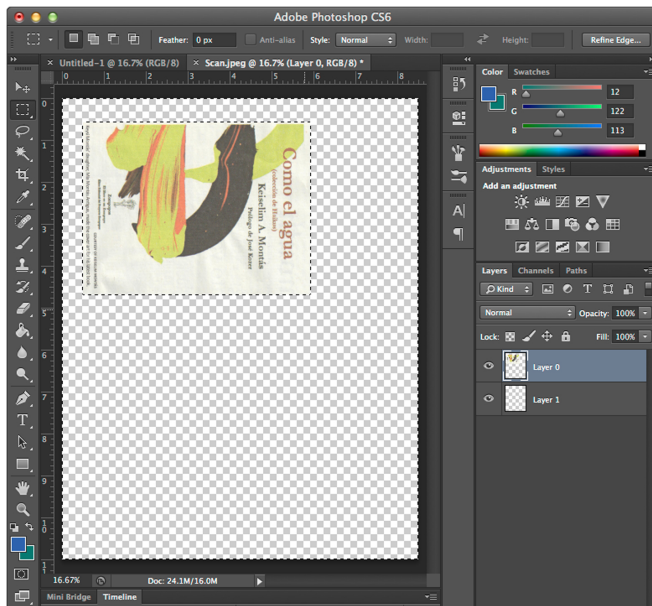


2. Open your image in photoshop. Your image will be set as a "background". Rename this layer to Layer 0 to unlock it. Create a new blank layer under Layer 0. Using the selection tool (shortcut: M) or the Wand tool (shortcut: W) select the artwork.

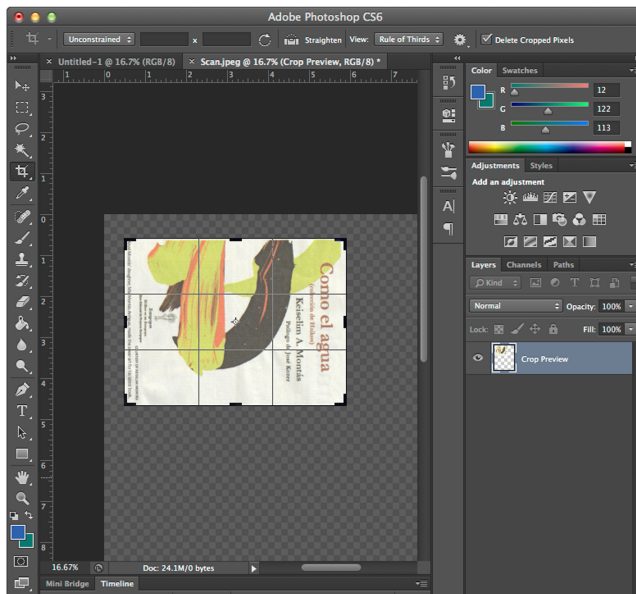

3. Using command-i, invert the selection and delete all unnecessary artwork,



4. Using the crop tool, Crop your image down to the size of your artwork making sure your anchor point is in the correct place. After your image is cropped save your psd.
