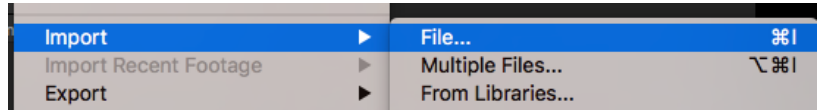
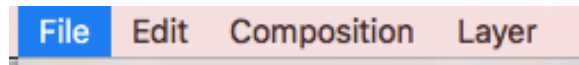
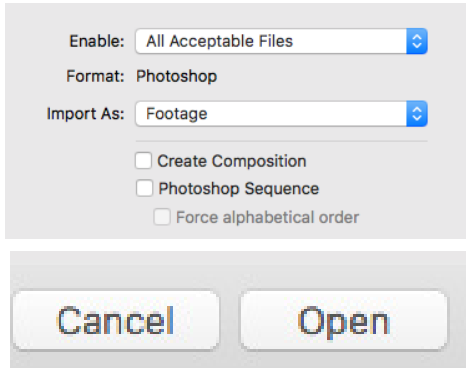


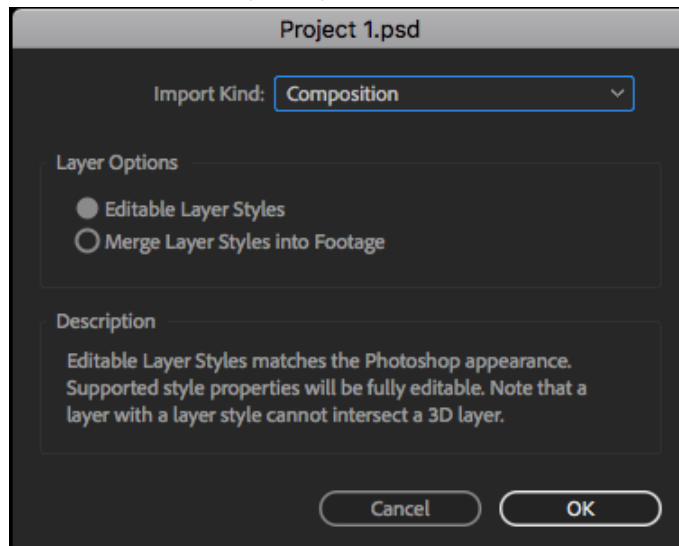
Sequencing Layers in After Effects



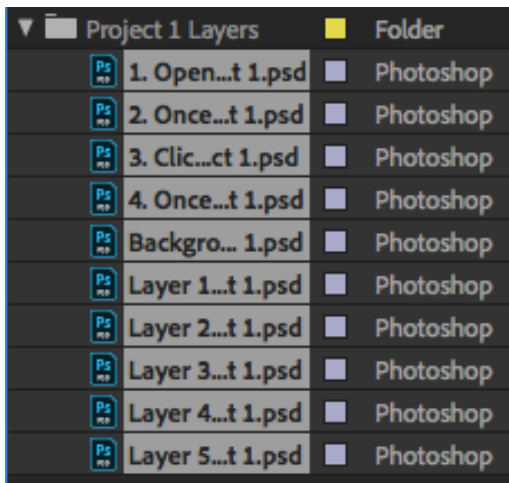
Import your Photoshop project into After Effects. To do this go to: “File > Import > File...” Then navigate to your project folder and select the .PSD file. In the next window simply press “Open”



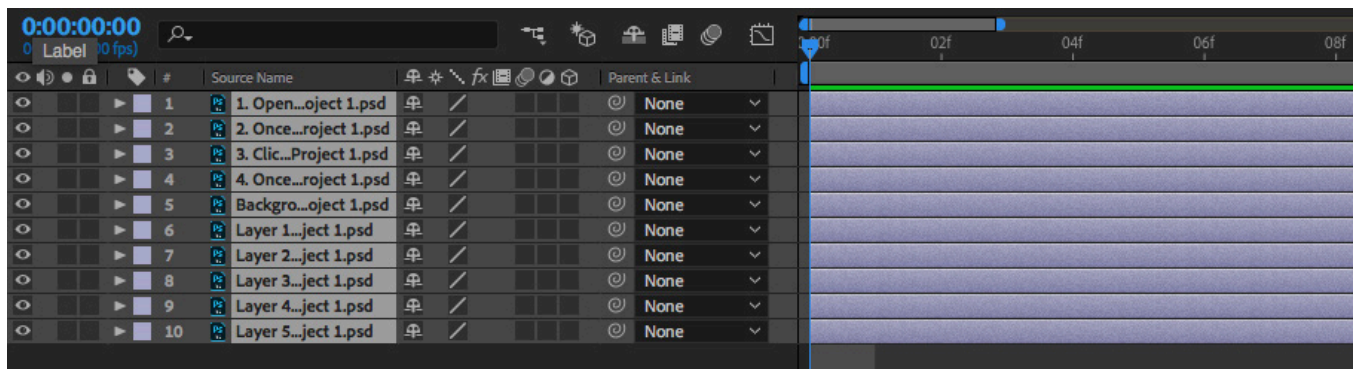
Make sure to change the “Import Kind” to Composition. Select “Editable Layer Styles,” and press “OK”



Now locate your layers under the project tab. They will be in a drop down folder.



Select your layers. Drag and drop them into the timeline.

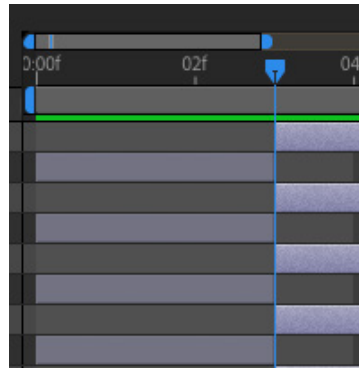
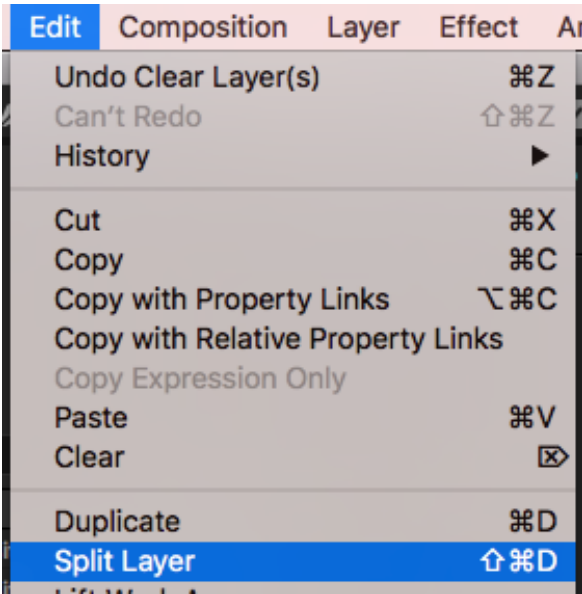


You now need to adjust the length of your layers. You can adjust each layer to a specific length, or cut them all down to the same length.

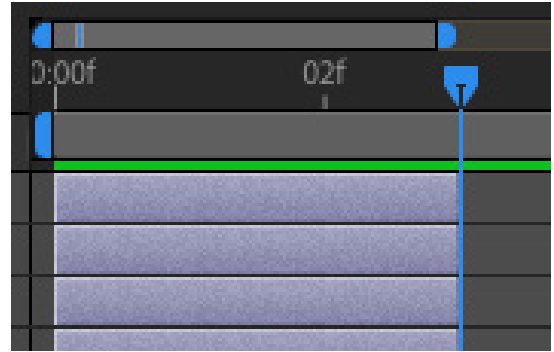
Select all layers. Place your playhead at the precise length. Here, the playhead is at 3 frames. You can check what frame your playhead is on in the left corner of the timeline.



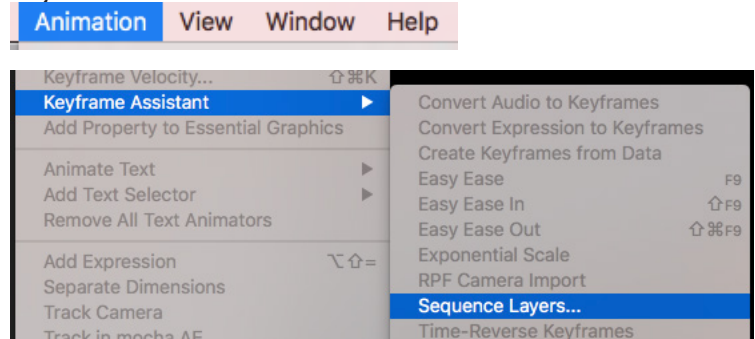
With the playhead placed and the layers selected, Go: "Edit > Split Layer"



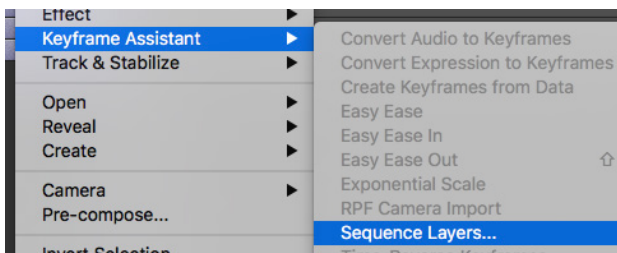
Your timeline will now look staggered like this -> The long ends of each layer are automatically selected, so simply press "Delete," and you'll be left with this



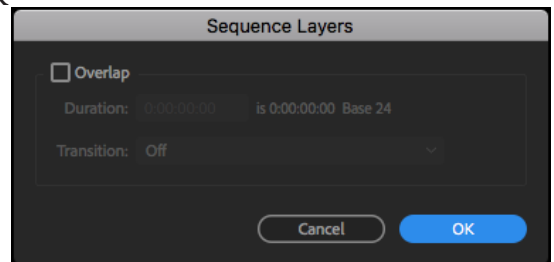
With the layers still selected, Go: "Animation > Keyframe Assistant > Sequence Layers"



An alternative is to right click on your selected layers, then choose "Keyframe Assistant > Sequence Layers"



Do not Overlap. Press "OK"



Your sequenced layers will appear in the timeline. If you want to change the length of the layers simply do so and then repeat the previous two steps
