



Setting up your After Effects Project

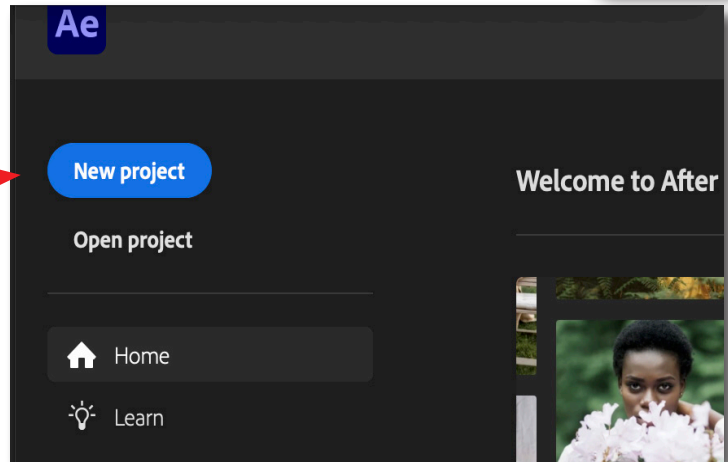
When After Effects launches you will see this “Start” window.

Click **New Project**,

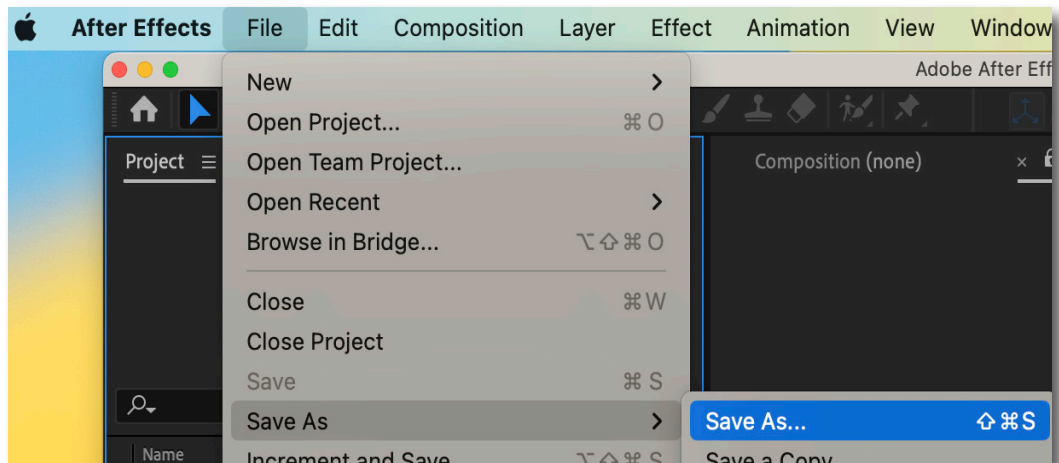


and the After Effects workspace will open.

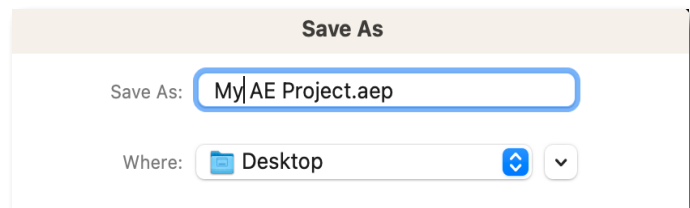
To set your Project in good order, you should first give your project a name and set the location it will be saved to.



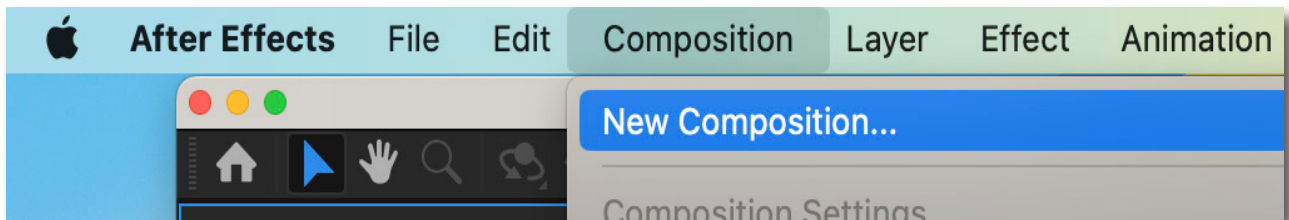
From the top menu go to *File > Save As...*



and in the window that opens name your project, and using the *Where:* pulldown menu navigate to a place where you will save it, such as a folder on the desktop or the local server.



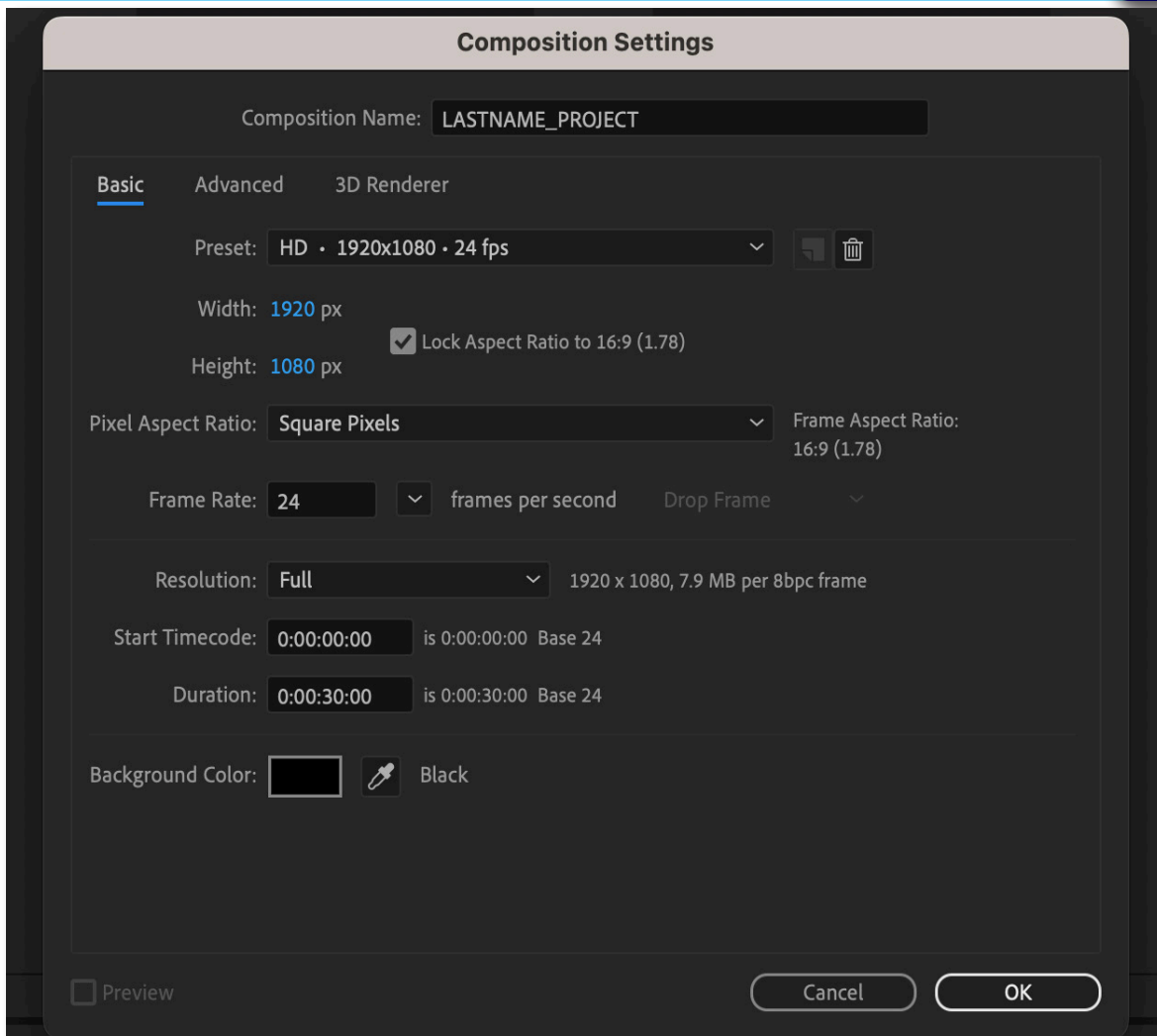
Once saved, go to the top menu and select *Composition>New Composition*



Next we will check the settings in the **Composition** window that opens.



Setting up your After Effects Project



The *Composition Name* is not the project name, just the name of your composition - similar to a sequence in Premiere

- **Preset:** HD 1920x1080 24 fps
 - **Width:** 1920 px
 - **Height:** 1080 px
- and check that the *Lock Aspect Ratio to 16:9* box is checked
- **Pixel Aspect Ratio:** Square Pixels
 - **Frame Rate:** 24 frames per second
 - **Resolution:** Full
 - **Start Timecode:** 0.00.00.00
 - **Duration:** however long your timeline needs to be; 30 seconds is a good starting place
 - **Background Color:** Black

When these settings are ready, click the **OK** button on the bottom right
